Elizabeth Mae Holland, age 87, died of stage 4 breast cancer Thursday, August 8th 2019 at St Therese Senior Living in New Hope, Minnesota.

Honoring her wishes, she was cremated and taken to Colorado for her Celebration of Life service. She will be buried in Anchorage Alaska at Fort Richardson National Cemetery in a shared plot with her husband Jerry W Holland who passed in 2003.
