Harold enjoyed downhill skiing in Alta, Utah until age 85, and was a model-plane builder and flyer for

many years. He was an author, and always very involved with his community including Champlin, MN, where a city park was named “Harold Johnson Park” in his honor and St Therese of Oxbow Lake where he chaired the tenant council and organized many Fine Arts activities.
